Every term, the school is required to record student attendance which includes lateness to school and early dismissals. What is worth noting is that by the mere nature of arriving late and missing school hours, students receive fewer hours of instruction than students who are in class when the bell rings. Not only does a student who is consistently arriving late to school establish bad punctuality habits, their tardiness also disrupts the learning of other students in their class. Students who are frequently late to school often miss out on important announcements and academic activities.

Teachers can become frustrated as late students disrupt instruction, often requiring reteaching of what they have missed in a lesson. Arriving late to school can also mean that students miss out on activities designed to build connections with their peers, potentially impacting their social interactions and creating a greater sense of alienation from their classmates.



This term, **I ask that students arrive before 8.45am each day** to ensure they are in class on time and ready for the day's activities. Punctuality is an important trait to instil in every student as it sets a standard for the future.

Winter uniform is now to be worn and all students need to ensure they are wearing their full winter uniform please. Hats are optional this term but need to be kept at school for days when the UV reading is high.

This term, Independence Days are **Tuesdays and Thursdays** commencing next week. We are grateful for parents and caregivers support as we work together to develop resilience and build independence in our students.

The Parent Network will be hosting our annual **Mother's Day Stall on Friday, May 10th** whereby gifts range from 50c to \$15.00. For new families to the school, this entails students visiting the Community Centre on this Friday and having the opportunity to purchase a special gift for their mother or special person in their life.
