Outreach Crazy Odd Sock Day

On Friday 27th September, the Year 1 Unit organised Crazy Odd Sock Day. Well done to the community raising \$394.00 for Catholic Charities.



SOCKTOBER

The Year 5 Unit has been learning about Catholic Mission as part of the Socktober Challenge 2024. Socktober allows our students to work together for the common good and engage in a fundraiser that will help take action against poverty through the world game of soccer.

In 2023, the impact of Socktober around Australia with the participation of 554 schools included over \$600K raised which supported 153 children's projects for Timor-Leste. The money raise helped to promote nutrition and health programs in schools in Venilale through the Maria Auxiliadora Clinic. The program now benefits 4,921 students across 24 schools. Auriel*, a Year 6 student, shares, *"The benefit of the healthy nutrition program is increasing our knowledge about nutritious eating. It teaches us how to prepare healthy meals, make better food choices, and enhances our understanding of nutrition."*

As part of the Catholic Social Teaching, our Year 5 students have been working hard making soccer balls out of recycled materials from plastic bags, rubber bands and natural fabrics from donated socks. The students have learnt about raising awareness and funds for the Caring Centre in Mongolia. The Caring Centre provides a home for Otgonbayar and his friends who have nowhere else to call home.

The Year 5 students will be hosting our fundraising event with a **kick off day on Friday 18th October.**

All classes will have the opportunity to play some soccer and kick some goals using the handmade balls made by our Year 5 students. Please make sure to bring in a gold coin donation on this day to support Socktober Challenge 2024.
