

LEADERSHIP NEWS

Greetings!

I hope that you and your child(ren) have had a good start to the 2025 school year. The beginning of the school year is always so interesting. We spend the first two or three weeks setting our students up for success by ensuring that they know all the rules and expectations for the year, start to make strong connections with their classmates and teachers and further develop their executive function, ready for the curriculum they will encounter in their new year level. Executive function is a set of mental skills. It includes working memory, flexible thinking, and self-control. We use these skills every day to learn, work, and manage daily life. Trouble with executive function can make it hard to focus, follow directions, and handle emotions, among other things. While we are setting our students up for a successful year, it is often said "We/They aren't doing any work." This is probably the most important work of all for without this preparation the students' executive function as well as their disposition for learning and in turn their well-being will be compromised.

APRIM NEWS

Welcome everyone,

Over the last 5 weeks we have been in Green Ordinary Time (Year C) which refers to a liturgical period in the Church calendar that focuses on spiritual growth, discipleship, and the teachings of Jesus Christ.

Luke 9:23-25

"Then he said to them all: 'Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will save it. What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, and yet lose or forfeit their very self?'"

This passage speaks to the cost of discipleship and emphasises the ongoing call to follow Jesus, even in the midst of ordinary life. It encourages spiritual growth through self-denial and commitment to the teachings of Christ, making it an appropriate reflection during the time of Green Ordinary Time.



Next week, the Church will observe two significant events: **Shrove Tuesday** and **Ash Wednesday**, marking the beginning of **Lent** and an important time of reflection and spiritual renewal.

Shrove Tuesday, also known as Pancake Day, is the day before Ash Wednesday and is traditionally a time of preparation for the season of Lent. The term "shrove" comes from the word "shrive," which means to confess or to be absolved of sins.

Shrove Tuesday was also a day to use up rich and indulgent foods, such as eggs, butter and sugar, before the fasting and abstinence of Lent began. This is why many cultures have developed traditions of making pancakes or other rich foods to enjoy before the season of fasting. The spirit of Shrove Tuesday is one of joyful celebration in preparation for the more solemn period of Lent, and it serves as a reminder to Christians to reflect on their lives, repent, and prepare for the journey of renewal that Lent. Thank you to the Parent Network and volunteers who will be making over 700 pancakes for our students and staff.



The following day, **Ash Wednesday**, marks the beginning of Lent, a 40-day period of fasting, prayer, and penance leading up to Easter. On Ash Wednesday, we will gather for a Liturgy to receive ashes on our foreheads in the shape of a cross. This ritual is a powerful symbol of mortality, repentance, and humility. The ashes are made from the palm branches from the previous year's Palm Sunday, which is a sign of continuity and the connection between Christ's Passion and his Resurrection.

Lent is a time of transformation, modelled after Jesus' 40 days of fasting in the desert. During this period, we are encouraged to engage in deeper prayer, fasting, and practices that allow us to grow closer to God. It is a time to reflect on Christ's sacrifice and to prepare spiritually for the joy of Easter, celebrating the Resurrection. The colour purple remains a constant visual cue for this period of Lent and helps the faithful prepare their hearts for Easter. Purple calls us to enter a deeper relationship with God, striving for renewal through prayer, fasting, and acts of charity. This brings us to our community's support of our Lenten journey through **Caritas Australia's Project Compassion**.

God of our journey,

We are all pilgrims of hope, brought together by Your love and Your desire that we may all be one. We pray that in this Year of Jubilee, when we are called to greater justice and care for our common home,

we may Unite Against Poverty.

May we work in unity for the freedom of the oppressed and the renewal of creation.

May our compassionate minds and generous hearts help bring about a world where all can live in peace.

May our Lenten pilgrimage of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer bring us closer to Your loving heart.

We ask this in the name of Jesus.

Creation Carer

The Justice Group had the opportunity to share our story of St. Martin's with other schools and further develop essential leadership skills.

Outreach

Last Friday, the Year 4 Unit officially launched their Outreach Project in support of Caritas Australia's Project Compassion. This Lent, Project Compassion invites us to Unite Against Poverty and take meaningful action to create lasting change. The Community Hall was filled with vibrant colours as students wore their house tshirts and contributed gold coin donations to their respective house buckets. Congratulations to the Blue Team, Hartzer, for collecting the most donations. The students and staff raised \$889.75. Throughout the term, the Year 4 classes will be hosting a variety of activities during recess and lunch to raise funds for Project Compassion. Some of the planned events include a colouring competition, a sports activity, and a "Guess How Many Lollies in the Jar" challenge.

We encourage families to send an additional 50c to school to allow students to participate in these activities. More details will be provided soon. The school goal is to raise money to go towards a 10,000-litre rainwater tank for a school in Samoa.




MARTY'S PLAY FOREVER PLAYGROUP
